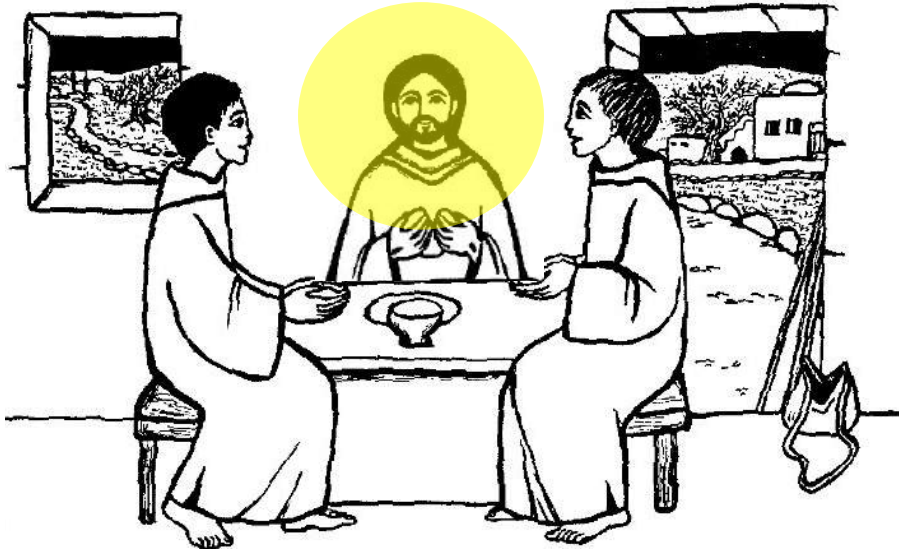
Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he **gave thanks** and **broke them**. Then he **gave them** to the disciples to distribute to the people.
