**S** – **SATISFIED** possessing an inner sense of abundance

- The journey begins by learning the secret of CONTENTMENT, freeing us from the tyranny of always wanting more.
- The journey unfolds into the practice of Godly PARTNERSHIP (koinonia), from receiving into giving and from transacting into WORSHIPPING.
- The journey culminates in TRUSTING GOD as THE ONE who supplies all our needs.
